

Central High School Summer School 2018 FAQ

What is it? Central High School's 2018 summer school is an opportunity for students to regain lost credits through an online provider. Central High School will provide transportation and a structured environment. There will be teachers on-site to give help as needed and as possible, however they are there to answer questions and provide quick help only.

What is it not? Central High School's 2018 summer school is not a guarantee of credit. Whether any credits are actually gained is entirely up to the student. It is also not a traditional classroom setting—students will not receive daily instruction or traditional assignments. All courses are taken online.

When is it? Monday-Thursday, June 4-June 28. Classes are from 8:00 until 12:00 with a short break. Lunch will not be served, but snacks will be for sale during the break. Leaving early is the same as missing the entire day.

How much does it cost? Tuition is \$50 per student. Tuition is payable by cash or money order only.

How many classes can I work on? Students will only have access to one course at a time.

Can I work on my class at home? Yes, students may watch the videos, read passages, take quizzes, etc. at home.

If I can work at home, do I have to come to summer school every day? No. Attendance is mandatory the first week and then on Tuesdays and Thursdays of the following weeks. Mondays and Wednesdays are optional but highly encouraged. Students are allowed to miss a maximum of two days (Mondays and Wednesdays do not count toward this maximum).

Once I complete a course, do I still have to attend? Once students have recovered at least one semester credit they may stop attending.

Can I work on my classes after summer school has ended but before the school year begins? Students who recover at least one half credit during summer school or who finish the summer in good standing (made adequate weekly progress and missed no more than two days) may continue working on their classes after summer school ends. Students must work at home but test at school during this time.

Will there still be credit recovery available during the school year? At-home credit recovery during the school year will be limited to students who recovered at least one semester credit during summer school or who finished the summer in good standing and to seniors who fail a first semester course. If you have credits that need to be recovered but do not complete summer school, you will need to wait for the following summer to work on your classes. If you fail a first semester course, you will only be allowed to attempt to recover that credit during the school year if you are a senior.

Can I use summer school for new work? Yes, but all the rules still apply. Also keep in mind that there are specific guidelines about which classes students are allowed to pursue through Edgenuity.

Where do I sign up? You can sign up beginning May 23 in the front office. Sign-ups will continue through May 30.
